

HELPING TRUSTEES AVOID LIABILITY — THE DUTY TO ADMINISTER THE TRUST

The most basic of a trustee's duties is to administer the trust. Everything else builds from there. The trustee must administer the trust in good faith and in accordance with its terms and purposes and the interests of the beneficiaries.

To do this, a trustee should:

- \rightarrow Read the entire trust document.
- \rightarrow Determine the purpose of the trust.
- \rightarrow Identify all the beneficiaries.
- \rightarrow Determine the assets of the trust.
- \rightarrow Understand the trustee's powers and duties.
- \rightarrow Inform the beneficiaries of the trust.
- → If any terms are ambiguous, ask the court for guidance and a ruling.
- → Consider whether the trustee should engage other professionals to carry out the purpose of the trust, such as accountants, wealth managers or attorneys.

Following these simple steps will give the trustee a solid foundation for compliance with the duty to administer the trust.
