



Staying Legal Overseas: 5 Things You Need to Know About Your Company's International Movement

- 1.** It is a **myth** that U.S. nationals do not need work permission to conduct business overseas.
- 2.** U.S. nationals traveling internationally for **anything more than a business meeting** will typically need a work permit.
- 3.** Correct immigration permission must be obtained **before** business operations are conducted in a foreign country for a U.S. office.
- 4.** Incorrect or a lack of permissions and/or documentation for international movement could leave your company open to **fines, deportation** of employee(s) and **reputational risk** resulting in potential loss of business and profit.
- 5.** **International movement** includes, but is not limited to, business trips, international projects, international sales agreements and establishing a new overseas entity.
